Who should attend?

- Older adults and their caregivers

Who needs a Power of Attorney or a Living Will?

- Anyone who wants to be sure that his/her health and financial decisions are made according to their plans.
- A **Power of Attorney** is a legal document that allows you to appoint a trusted person to make health care and/or property decisions on your behalf in the event you become incapacitated in the future.
- A **Living Will** is more limited than a Power of Attorney for Healthcare. It allows you to describe the type of care you want at the end of your life.

What should you bring?

- Driver's License or State picture ID card
- Name, address and phone number of the person who will receive Powers of Attorney or be listed in your Living Will. This person should be:
 1. Someone you know well and trust implicitly
 2. Younger and healthier than you
 3. At least 18 years or older, competent, and may not be your primary health care provider
