- For people 60+ years old.
- Live in suburban Cook County.
- Meals meet federal dietary standards.

- No income qualification for most programs.
- Donation requested, never required.





Congregate Meal Program Details



- Meals can be eaten on at the site, or taken to go.
- Most sites open Monday through Friday,
 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.
- Most offer hot, general diets
- Some sites offer:
 - Ethnic meals: Korean, Chinese, South Asian, Halal, etc.
 - Medically tailored diets: Diabetic, Renal,
 Gluten Free, etc.



HOME DELIVERED MEALS

Home Delivered Meal Program Details

- HDM provided in every suburban Cook County Township
- Enough meals for 5 days a week
- Meals can be hot, cold or frozen
- Medically tailored diets available
- Participants must be assessed for eligibility by appropriate agency
- Call AgeOptions at (708) 383-0258






MEAL KITS

Grocery Delivery Program Details

- Meal Kits are delivered to homes once a week.
- Boxes contain:
 - Fresh fruits and produce
 - Frozen meats
 - Variety of packaged food
 - Grains (rice, pasta, bread)
 - Condiments, seasonings
 - Other items
 - Menus to help make three meals each day
- Participants must be assessed for eligibility by appropriate agency
- Call AgeOptions at (708) 383-0258



SENIOR FARMERS MARKET NUTRITION PROGRAM

Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program Details

- Provides five \$10 coupons (total: \$50/person) that participants can redeem for fresh fruits or produce at registered farmers markets
- Operates July through October
- 185% of Federal Poverty Level or less
- No request for donation

EMERGENCY SHELF-STABLE MEALS

Emergency Shelf-Stable Meals Details

- Each Box contains 7 Shelf-Stable meals to use in an emergency.
- Boxes are issued to Congregant Meal & Home Delivered Meal participants every six months (March & October) to be kept at home.





Alsip-Merrionette Public Library: Accessible Computer Station

"Jim," an older adult, visited the library requesting help with an online payment. Jim has impaired vision, and previously brought a magnifying glass from home, holding it against the keyboard and the computer monitor.

With AgeOptions funds, we set up a new accessible computer station to assist vision-impaired visitors, including a 27" touch screen monitor with ZoomText magnification software, a large print contrast keyboard, several assistive mouse options, and a handheld magnifier with a light.

When Jim saw the keyboard with giant letters, he said, "Hey, I can see that." The touchscreen also made navigating much easier and faster for him. Jim can now complete this biannual task quickly and independently.


